Paws, Claws and Whiskers

- Use the internet to find out where some wild animals live, their habitat and what they eat.
- Find some pictures of animals in books/on the internet/in magazines. Compare the pictures and choose your favourite.
 Create an animal picture of your own and write 2 facts about your chosen animal.
- Choose an animal story to read. Examples include: The Tiger Who
 Came to Tea by Judith Kerr, The Hare and the Tortoise by Brian
 Wildsmith or How to Hide a Lion by Helen Stephens. Draw a
 picture of your favourite event in the story. Write a few sentences
 beneath your picture to explain what is happening.
- Choose a pet that you would like to investigate. Research how to look after the pet. Record your findings, including what pet you have chosen, what it eats, where it should live and any special things this pet needs.
- Look out on to your street, explore your garden and take a walk
 in your neighbourhood to look for animals. Record the animals
 that you see in a table. Use the data you have collected to find
 out which type of animal was the most and least common.
