Covid-19 Catch up Premium Report

The Government has announced £1 billion of fudning to support children and young people to catch up. This includes a one-off universal catch up premium to ensure that schools have the support they need to help pupils make up for lost teaching time. The school's allocation has been calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil in Years R - 11.

Below is the St Nicholas at Wade strategy to address gaps in learning caused by Covid disruption. It has been informed by the Education Endowment Foundation Covid-19 support guide for schools.

Impact of lockdown

Every school is unique in the way in which Covid -19 has disrupted learning in their school. Consequently, schools have flexibility to spend their funding in the best way for their cohort and circumstances.

Formal and informal assessment on pupils return to school has shown the following areas as priorities for our school:

- Writing Children have lost some basic skills in punctuation and grammar. They have less writing stamina and have lost some skills in editing and redrafting their writing. Children are less resilient and require more scaffolding with their writing.
- ➤ Phonics Some specific content has been missed and because of different levels of engagement with home learning gaps between children are greater.
- Reading is our strongest subject post lockdown but there are some children who have not had as much support with their reading as others and comprehension and inference skills are a key focus for us.
- Maths Pupils generally continued to make good progress with their mental arithmetic and times tables but problem solving and multi step questions will be a focus moving forward.
- Foundation subjects Tracking of coverage and progress in foundation subjects has become very difficult during covid gaps in learning mean that pupils do not have prior knowledge to refer to or have not benefitted from the rich experiences of visits to places of interest and events both at school and with their families.
