Grammar schools and those Academies which select their intake through the 11+ assessment procedure are by definition selective schools.

- More academically able

- 25% of the top ability range in Kent
- Fast pace

PESE Process: Key Dates



If you want to apply for a year 7 place at a Kent grammar School place for 2023, you can register your child for the Kent Test. The test assesses whether your child will be deemed suitable for entry to a grammar school.

Registration for the Kent Test for children due to start secondary school in September 2024 will open on **Thursday 1 June 2023** and will close at midnight on **Monday 3 July 2023**.

The tests are due to take place on Thursday 7 September 2023

Kent Test result will be emailed to you after 4pm on Wednesday 18 October 2023

School places

Primary school places

Apply for a reception year place at primary or infant school, or a year 3 place at a junior school.

Secondary school places

Apply for a year 7 school place.

Move to a different school

Apply for an in year admission to move your child to a different school within Kent or if you're moving into Kent.



Kent Test

Register your child for the Kent Test if you want to apply for a place at a Kent grammar school.

School age

Find out what age your child can start and finish school.

Choosing a school

Find out about schools you're interested in and check their admissions criteria.

Format



Feel free to look at the examples.

Paper 1

Multiple Choice English and Mathematics 30 mins each section including practice questions

Paper 2

Multiple Choice Reasoning - looks at how quickly and efficiently children solve problems. 30 mins each section:

- Verbal reasoning questions are based on words.
- Non Verbal Reasoning questions are based on numbers, patterns and sequences. (Split into 4 sections individually timed).

Format



Writing - not marked at this stage (40 mins)

This will not be marked and is not something that will affect a child's standardised score. It may be used by a local headteacher panel to review borderline cases.

Your child's scoring

Your child will get **three scores**, 1 for English, 1 for maths and 1 for reasoning. The scores are standardised (a statistical process which compares your child's performance with the average performance of other children in each test). A slight adjustment is made to take into account each child's age so that the youngest are not at a disadvantage.

The score ranges for September 2023 will be published nearer the time.

Scoring 2022



To be given a grammar school assessment, children needed a total score of 332 or more, with no single score lower than 108. Test scores range from 69 to 141. The highest possible total score is 423.

Headteacher Appeal:

In some cases, children have been assessed suitable for grammar school via their local Head Teacher Assessment panel, with a score below the 332 total score threshold.

Children may also score higher than 332, but still be assessed as suitable for comprehensive school in cases where 1 or more of their individual scores were below 108.

Admissions Process into Secondary



- •There will be a standard form known as a Secondary Common Application Form (SCAF) **September 2023.**
- Parents will be invited to express four preferences in priority order.
- •Some schools may ask parents to provide additional information on a supplementary form; this must be returned to the school you are applying to. This is not an application form; the only valid application form is the SCAF.
- •The SCAF needs to be completed by 1st November 2023 (TBC).
- March 2023 all parents will be notified of the school allocated for their child.

Admissions Process into Secondary



- Many of the Thanet schools were oversubscribed last year.
- You MUST fulfil the admissions criteria for a school in order to be offered a place.
