FAMILY PICNIC (STAY AND PLAY) - WEDNESDAY 28th JUNE 2023

This will give you a chance as parents to meet each other and the children a chance to play with their new friends after a sandwich or two! It is also an opportunity for you to try some activities with your child so that they can start with confidence. Please could you confirm your attendance via the school office.

TASTER SESSIONS – WEDNESDAY 5TH JULY 2023 (AM or PM slot will be allocated)
Following the picnic you are invited to a taster session at school, this will take place on
Wednesday 5th July, 9.30-10.30am (Children with surnames A-H ONLY) or Wednesday 5th
July, 1.15-2.15pm (Children with surnames I-Z ONLY).

This session will be an opportunity for your child to stay for a short period by themselves. Staff will be on hand to help encourage your child to say goodbye. We welcome you to help settle them and then join other new parents in the library for a cup of tea and slice of cake whilst your little one is busy exploring their new classroom. Mrs Kennedy and Mrs Moon will be available in the library to welcome you. The children do not need to wear school uniform for these visits, unless they would like to! If you are concerned about your child settling in this session please speak to Mrs Hall or Miss Buckley. Could you please also hand back all enclosed forms on this day and bring in your child's birth certificate/passport and proof of address to be copied if it hasn't been already.

HOME VISITS – BEGINNING 4TH SEPTEMBER 2023

Home visits will take place in the week **beginning 4th September 2023**. You will be notified of your time at the taster sessions. Due to staffing and logistics we will be unable to change any visits. This is an informal visit to your home where Mrs Hall and Miss Buckley can chat to you as a parent whilst the teaching assistant can play with your child. It is an ideal time to find out a little more about you and your child, as well as answer any questions that you might have.

If your child has any medical conditions, allergies or dietary requirements it may be useful to have this information to hand. Please save any records from nurseries/playschools for this date too.

INDUCTION PERIOD

Home visits will take place from Monday 4th September 2023

Half days begin week commencing Monday 11th – Friday 15th September 2023 8.45am-10.45am - (Children with surnames A-H ONLY) 1pm-3pm - (Children with surnames I-Z ONLY)

All children attend FULL TIME - From Monday 18th September 2023 - (8.35am-3.10pm)

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THE SCHOOL DAY

Pupils should arrive at school between 8:35 and 8:45 a.m. The gate opens at 8:35 a.m. and pupils go directly to their classes, however for the first few weeks we invite you to bring your child down to the classroom. After this time we ask parents to say goodbye to their child at the gate. Any messages can be passed to the member of staff stood at the gate.

Punctuality allows your child to begin the school day in the correct frame of mind, whereas lateness not only disadvantages the child but also disrupts the beginning of lessons. If pupils are unavoidably late for school, please ensure that they report to the school office, before going to their classroom.

Parents of Reception and Year 1 pupils should collect their children from the classroom at 3:10p.m, all other pupils should be collected from the playground by 3:15p.m.

SCHOOL LUNCHES

We do not have a kitchen here on site and therefore hot meals are brought in to school, having been prepared at one of our neighbouring schools. The government fund free school meals for all infant pupils. This is catered for by the school's chosen service, Nourish. Alternatively, you may provide your child with a packed lunch. Please ensure that this is light, healthy and well balanced.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL INCLUDING HOLIDAYS

Schools are required to record the reasons for all pupil absence; to help us in this task, if your child is absent from school, you <u>must</u> inform us of the reason as soon as possible, preferably before school begins and by 9.00 a.m. at the latest on the first day of absence. If we do not receive information regarding a child's absence we will send a text to ensure that the child has not been dropped at school and not arrived in class. If your child arrives at school after 9.30 a.m. without notification, the lateness has to be recorded as unauthorised absence. Since September 2013 Head Teachers have been unable to agree leave of absence during term time unless they are satisfied there are exceptional circumstances. Where leave of absence is taken without authorisation a Penalty notice may be issued. If you believe there are exceptional circumstances please make a request in writing alongside the appropriate form available from the school office or website.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

School uniform is valued as an important feature of our school and is worn by all of our children. Parents must ensure that pupils are dressed in our school uniform; we think this looks smart and gives the children a sense of pride in belonging to our school community.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are labelled. Like all schools we accumulate a great deal of un-named, unclaimed lost property each term; if property is clearly labelled we are usually successful in returning it. Please also provide us with a pair of name labelled wellington boots.
